

# Artillery

## Smooth Brome

Artillery is a very high yielding drought-tolerant, productive smooth brome. It is rhizomatous and earlier smooth brome. It was developed from selections from arid regions of Turkey, Iran, Spain and Mongolia. The developed population was then selected in Oklahoma high stress conditions that included no irrigation with low nitrogen input.

Artillery has good germination and establishment in droughty conditions. Brome prefers sandy loam to light clay loam soils, and in general, succeeds anywhere timothy can be grown.

High levels of fertility are not essential, but on lighter soils an annual application of a high nitrogen fertilizer is recommended, unless it is growing with a legume.
