

# Malabar

## Wheat

A mid-season, awnless wheat, with consistent yields and excellent disease resistance. Moderate resistance to Fusarium Head Blight. A taller stature than most wheats; good standability.

### Soil Adaptation

Wet – Difficult because wet areas may exacerbate winterkill problems and interfere with harvesting. The crop itself is fairly tolerant, however.

Drought – Fair. Productive during fall and spring, which tends to reduce drought risk.

pH Range –6.0 and above

### Forage Management

Later harvest than rye or triticale. Cut at flag leaf stage before head has emerged. Can be grazed once plants reach 6-12 inches.

### Grain Management

Follow local university recommendations.
