

Deon Oats

Deon Oats are a yellow later-heading variety bred by the University of Minnesota, and are tall and high yielding with a high test weight. Deon has excellent disease resistance and stands well. Produces very stiff straw. The variety is named after Deon Stuthman, the longterm breeder at the University of Minnesota.

At A Glance:

Key Features:

- ◇ Taller, late maturing, high yielding oat with a high test weight.

Uses

- Grain
- Forage
- Nurse Crop
- Cover Crop

Establishment:

Use the large seed box

For Grain: Seed as early in the winter/spring as feasible. 100lbs/A

For Forage: Seed in early spring or 4-6 weeks prior to the beginning of wheat seeding. 125lbs/A

Seeding Depth: 1/2"-3/4" is ideal. Do not seed deeper than 1" or ryegrass will not emerge.

Speed: Establishes quickly
